SUBJECT: APPROVE A FISCAL YEAR 2018 MASTER CONTRACT AUGMENTATION FOR SENECA FAMILY OF AGENCIES IN THE AMOUNT OF \$806,013

RECOMMENDATIONS

- A. Approve a master contract augmentation for Seneca Family of Agencies (Principal: Katherine West; Location: San Leandro; Master Contract No. 900121, Procurement Contract No. 15256) to increase mental health services for children and youth with no change in the contract period of 7/1/17 – 6/30/18, increasing the procurement contract amount from \$23,969,014 to \$24,627,190 (\$658,176 increase);
- B. Delegate authority to the Director of Health Care Services Agency or her designee to execute the attached procurement contract exhibits on your behalf upon approval as to form by County Counsel; and
- C. Delegate authority to Director of Health Care Services Agency or her designee to execute the attached Memorandum of Understanding between BHCS and Education For Change Public Charter Schools Administration after review and approval by County Counsel.

DISCUSSION/SUMMARY

Alameda County Behavioral Health Care Services (BHCS) contracts with Seneca Family of Agencies (Seneca) to provide critical mental health services to children and youth. BHCS is requesting approval of the following contract amendments: 1) Expand intensive counseling enriched special day classes (I-CESDC) at four sites, increasing staffing to serve elementary school students in special education; 2) Add a classroom to the Building Blocks Program, which is a Non-Public School serving young children who qualify for special education; 3) Shift funds to support San Lorenzo Unified School District (USD)'s Educationally-Related Mental Health Services (ERMHS) Outpatient Program; and 4) Execution of a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between BHCS with Education for Change (EFC) Public Charter Schools Administration.

First, BHCS contracts with Seneca to provide I-CESDCs, which are structured, intensive, school-based programs designed to address the student's mental health, emotional, and behavioral needs that create a barrier to effective learning. The students participating in I-CESDC have significant impairments in major life activities that have compromised their ability to self-regulate and thrive in contained or resourced classrooms without intensive interventions. Based on provider input, BHCS has determined that the current staffing level of two mental health staff per classroom was insufficient for providing adequate support for elementary level students

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in the I-CESDC. Elementary level classrooms require more supervision and support due to the students' developmental stage, behavioral and mental health needs and the fact that elementary students remain in the classrooms the entire school day.

Seneca has I-CESDC classrooms in four elementary schools: Bridges Academy at Melrose in Oakland; Longwood Elementary School in Hayward; Harvey Green Elementary School in Fremont; and Cragmont Elementary School in Berkeley. Your Board's approval of this augmentation will ensure that there are a minimum of three full-time equivalent mental health staff in each of their five classrooms, which will assist each classroom in holding a minimum census or eight students. This augmentation will preserve the current level of service delivery. Seneca is currently serving approximately 48 children per quarter across five I-CESDC elementary classrooms.

Second, Building Blocks is a therapeutic preschool program provided by Seneca. Building Blocks serves children ages three to five years, who have emotional and behavioral challenges that have resulted in them being unsuccessful in traditional preschool programs. In August of 2017, Building Blocks moved its two preschool and one Kindergarten through 1st Grade classes from its original site to a new location. Seneca also moved one of its elementary school classrooms from James Baldwin Academy, a non-public school, to Building Blocks' new site. The children up to 3rd grade are safer and more appropriately housed developmentally with the preschool population at Building Blocks campus, as oppose to the James Baldwin Academy campus which serves children through 12th grade. Seneca is requesting to open an additional elementary classroom to meet the increased demand for highly structured, intensive therapeutic elementary school settings.

The augmentation to Building Blocks will support the site in providing a total of three elementary classrooms serving children from Kindergarten to 3rd Grade, thus increasing the number of elementary school children they can serve from approximately 15 to 22 per quarter. The elementary program has been renamed Maya Angelou Academy. Building Blocks will continue to provide two preschool classrooms.

Third, local school districts are responsible for providing mental health services to any special education student with an Individual Education Plan (IEP) that specified such services were needed to succeed in school. The responsibility for these mental health services for special education students has been realigned from counties to the school districts through Educationally Related Mental Health Services (ERMHS). The BHCS Children's System of Care has partnered with local school districts within Alameda County to continue the provision of ERMHS to eligible children and youth, age five through 19 years old, who fit the criteria for the service need.

Seneca is contracted to provide ERMHS in San Lorenzo USD. In the Fiscal Year 2017-2018 budget, BHCS appropriated \$574,350 for this contracted program. On June 20, 2017 (Item No. 5), the amount approved by your Board for this contracted program was \$455,174. This augmentation will correct the discrepancy between the budgeted allocation and the approved contract allocation, assisting Seneca in reaching its current contracted goal of serving 60 children every month.

Fourth, Alameda County Health Care Services Agency (HCSA), EFC, (a non-profit charter management organization), and the BHCS Children and Young Adult System of Care have established a collaborative partnership to support mental health services for children attending EFC charter schools. BHCS is requesting approval of an MOU between BHCS and EFC to deliver Early Periodic Screening, Diagnosis and Treatment (EPSDT) services through School-Based Behavioral Health (SBBH) Services. EFC has agreed to fund the 50 percent Medi-Cal match for beneficiaries served. The parameters of the fiscal relationship are outlined in the attached MOU between BHCS and EFC. Seneca is contracted through BHCS to provide EPSDT services at four of the EFC schools: Cox Academy, Learning Without Limits, Epic, and Lazear Charter Academy. As of the first four months

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of this fiscal year, Seneca's EFC programs have served 41 children. The approval of the MOU will ensure that Seneca is able to serve the contracted 150 children at these four schools this year.

SELECTION CRITERIA

Your Board initially approved Seneca to provide mental health programs for children and youth as part of a previous expansion of EPSDT services on November 4, 2003 (Item No. 6) as a result of a Request for Information Process. Seneca was selected to provide crisis stabilization and outpatient services at Willow Rock Center through a Request for Proposal issued on June 7, 2006 (Item No. 14). Seneca currently provides I-CESDC and SBBH services at a variety of existing sites throughout Alameda County, including those noted in the Discussion/Summary section of this Board Letter. Seneca has been providing services at Longwood and Cragmont Elementary Schools for over ten years. Your Board approved an augmentation for Seneca to provide services at Harvey Green Elementary in November of 2008. As a result of RFP No. 15-01 released on February 19, 2015, your board approved Seneca to provide services at Bridges Academy at Melrose on July 21, 2015 (Item No. 5). Seneca has been contracting with BHCS to provide therapeutic preschool services at Building Blocks for over 20 years. Seneca has been contracted by BHCS to provide SBBH services at Cox Elementary School (its former name when the school was part of Oakland USD) since 2011 as part of the Oakland USD Our Kids Mental Health Program. San Lorenzo USD requested the mental health services that Seneca was already providing to ERMHS students in San Lorenzo USD be included under the BHCS contract with Seneca to allow San Lorenzo USD to leverage Medi-Cal revenue, resulting in a substantive savings for the school district while the USD remained responsible for covering costs not billable to Medi-Cal under the existing MOU between BHCS and San Lorenzo USD. Seneca was awarded the EFC: Learning without Limits contract through a previous Request for Proposal (RFP) process that was approved by your Board in February of 2014. Your board approved an augmentation for Seneca in October of 2016 to expand services to Epic and Lazaer Charter Academy as requested by EFC due to the existing relationship between EFC and Seneca. Seneca is a local, non-profit community-based organization and is exempt from requirements under the Small, Local and Emerging Business (SLEB) Program.

FINANCING

Funding will be provided utilizing Early Periodic Screening and Diagnosis and Treatment under 2011 Realignment, and Medi-Cal Revenue already included in the BHCS budget. There is no increase in net county cost as a result of your approval.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (MOU) Between Alameda County Behavioral Health Care Services And Education for Change Public Charter Schools For School Based Behavioral Health (SBBH) Programs at Cox Academy, Learning Without Limits, Epic, and Lazear Charter Academy

This Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) is between Alameda County Behavioral Health Care Services ("BHCS") and the Education for Change Public Charter Schools ("EFC") to provide School Based Behavioral Health Services (SBBH Services) for eligible students who attend Cox Academy, Learning Without Limits, Epic, and Lazear Charter Academy School starting on July 1, 2017 ending on June 30, 2018.

Whereas Charter schools are independent public schools with rigorous curriculum programs and unique educational approaches. Charter schools, which are tuition-free and open to all students, offer quality and choice in the public education system.

Whereas EFC operates public charter schools concentrated in the Oakland Unified School District. EFC's schools are heavily concentrated in two target neighborhoods – the Elmhurst and Fruitvale areas of Oakland.

Whereas EFC serves over 3,000 Transitional Kindergarten to eighth grade students in six schools throughout East Oakland's Elmhurst and Fruitvale neighborhoods.

Whereas 95% of EFC's student population qualifies for free or reduced lunch; 99% of EFC's student population are minorities (64% Latino, 19% African American, 7% American Indian or Alaska Native, 4% Native Hawaiian or Pacific Islander, 3% Asian, 2% Mixed Race); 4% of parents of EFC's students have college degrees; and 61.3% of EFC's students test as English Language Learners.

Whereas EFC values the social and emotional wellbeing of their students, provides Mental Health Services through contracts with Seneca Family of Agencies ("Seneca" or "Provider") for the provision of mental health services for students in need at Cox Academy, Learning Without Limits, Epic and Lazear Charter Academy.

Whereas BHCS is part of a larger Managed Health Care plan that provides health care services to youth and their families who meet service criteria. One of the ways to provide these services and make them accessible to families is to provide support in schools.

Whereas BHCS currently contracts with Seneca for SBBH Services through an Early Periodic Screening Diagnosis and Treatment ("EPSDT") contract for students in four EFC schools - Cox Academy, Learning Without Limits, Epic and Lazear Charter Academy Charter Schools, that qualify and are eligible for EPSDT services through Alameda County.

Whereas EPSDT is a federal and state Medicaid health care program. In 2003, BHCS began to expand these services to schools within Alameda County. In order to meet this need, BHCS has contracted with many community based organizations to expand mental health services for children and youth who qualify for EPSDT. EPSDT eligibility requires that a client have full-scope Alameda County Medi-Cal coverage, be

under the age of 21, and meet Medical Necessity criteria by having a qualifying mental health diagnosis. Under health care reform, mental health services are to be included as an essential health benefit. Beginning on January 1, 2014 Medi-Cal Managed Care Plans (MCPs) and primary care providers are expected to provide mental health services to individuals with mild to moderate impairments. Medi-Cal beneficiaries that meet medical necessity criteria with moderate-severe impairment will be referred to BHCS for Specialty Mental Health Services.

Whereas EFC would like BHCS (operating through BHCS's current contract with Seneca or future contracted EPSDT providers), to provide additional EPSDT services to Cox Academy, Learning Without Limits, Epic, and Lazear Charter Academy by expanding the BHCS EPSDT contract(s) for SBBH Services.

Now Therefore the Parties agree:

I. EFC Agrees To:

- 1. Provide dedicated and confidential clinical space that meets the Medi-Cal guidelines and where the mental health clinician(s) can see students and families. Clinicians shall not share space with other staff persons during their designated service hours. This space shall not be a cubicle or a location in the common area (i.e. Multipurpose Room).
- 2. Provide access to at least one dedicated confidential space to be used for group services, family meetings, and other psycho-educational group activities.
- 3. Have a dedicated on-site school administrator or designee who will be the point of contact for the school based mental health provider.
- 4. Have regular meetings with the school-based mental health provider to discuss school-based services. Teacher and other faculty and staff may be involved in these meetings.
- 5. Assist in the identification and referral of students who may be displaying behaviors that may be related to mental health challenges.
- 6. Actively participate in and refer students of concern to the Coordination of Service Team (COST) to be triaged and referred to appropriate support services.
- 7. Ensure that school faculty and staff are informed about the mental health referral process for both school-based services and are willing to partner with the school-based mental health provider to support the students and their families.
- 8. As needed, integrate a mental health provider into staff meetings, staff development trainings, and IEP process/student assistance team as needed.
- 9. Encourage parental involvement in the mental health assessment and treatment process.

II. <u>School-Based Behavioral Health Provider agrees to do the following:</u>

1. Provide qualified mental health staff to support the school-based mental health services as outlined in their contract with BHCS.

- 2. Screen any child referred for mental health supports for EPSDT/Medi-Cal service eligibility.
- 3. Accept referrals from school into services when appropriate and consistent with EPSDT eligibility criteria, and refer out if service and/or eligibility criteria are not met.
- 4. Mental Health Staff shall be located on each campus to provide group and/or individual therapy and counseling, rehabilitation, and case management services. Mental Health Staff will also engage the student's family in family treatment and make home visits, as determined necessary by Mental Health Staff, to support the student's progress.
- 5. Strictly adhere to all Mandate Reporting Guidelines as outlined in the Child Abuse and Neglect Reporting Act, sections 11164-11174.3 of the California Penal Code.
- 6. Maintain the confidentiality of client/student information received in accordance with the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA) Guidelines and signed release of information.
- 7. Communicate with school administration and/or designee of any immediate safety concerns resulting in a student being referred for a 5150 and or Child Abuse Reporting. This notification does not preclude the Provider from making the appropriate safety calls for assessment and/or reporting.
- 8. Meet monthly with school site and/or EFC administration regarding the effectiveness of the school-based mental health services.
- 9. Provider will follow all Alameda County documentation and claiming guidelines and keep all client files in locked cabinets as required by California Department of Mental Health and Medi-Cal guidelines.
- 10. Provider will follow Quality Assurance (QA) guidelines and attend Clinical Quality Review Team (CQRT) meetings with respect to ongoing authorization for services.
- 11. Provider will participate in BHCS outcome measure collection and will share unique outcome measures that they collect with BHCS.

III. School-Based Mental Health Provider Staffing

- 1. Employees providing mental health services will meet specific qualifications for the services provided. Additionally, clinicians will provide services only in areas in which they are licensed or credentialed.
- 2. Mental Health staff will not provide educational instruction; however, they will address emotional and behavior issues that may interfere with academic performance.
- 3. Provider will supply a Program Director and a Clinical Director who will oversee the program and provide administrative and clinical supervision to the on-site Mental Health Staff.

IV. Building and Grounds

- 1. EFC and/or governing Charter District will be responsible for the facility and will provide maintenance for the facility and classrooms, which will be overseen by the respective site Principals.
- 2. Office furniture and group room furniture will be supplied by EFC and/or governing Charter District. Service Provider will supply additional clinical furnishings, supplies and tools deemed necessary to provider services.
- 3. Phone lines will be supplied by EFC and/or governing Charter District.
- 4. EFC and/or governing Charter District will provide the clinician's offices with Internet or Wireless Internet capability and access.
- 5. Provider will supply the clinical staff with computers, locking file cabinets, and basic stationary.

V. <u>Both Parties Agree To:</u>

Problems identified by either the educational or mental health staff will be addressed promptly and resolved in a timely manner. Problem resolution procedures will include the immediate team resolving concerns as they arrive. If a resolution cannot be reached, any member of the team can request a meeting with the Administrative Team (site principal, BHCS representatives, EFC Program Manager, Provider Clinical Program Manager).

VI. <u>Budget Increases</u>

To support the increase in services, to the extent allowed, the EPSDT provider Seneca will bill EPSDT or Medi-Cal for qualifying services provided to students on Medi-Cal. Certified Public Expenditure (CPE) funds are non-federal dollars that may be used to match EPSDT Medi-Cal.

VII. Payments, Costs, Medi-Cal and Invoicing

- 1. **Payment:** EFC agrees to pay BHCS for all services and all related costs provided by or through BHCS. The obligation to make full payments pursuant to the terms of this MOU shall continue until full payment has been received from EFC, even if the MOU is terminated. Payment shall be made for all services and costs from the effective date of this MOU.
- 2. Cost: Wherever costs is referred to in this MOU, it refers to all costs included in the array of services provided and all associated costs, including clinician salaries and benefits, cost and expenses associated with student's failure to attend appointments, and administrative support costs specifically attributable to the provided services. Administrative costs include, but are not limited to, staff time for management of invoicing, billing, reimbursement, payments and program and payment monitoring activities. Costs may be calculated and billed based on a cost per unit that includes all administrative costs.
- 3. *Invoicing for services:* BHCS will provide EFC with invoices for services and other costs incurred on a quarterly basis. For all students receiving services the invoices may include the student's name, services provided, and the date(s) on which such services were provided, amount of service, costs incurred by BHCS associated with providing the services and breakdown of federal and non-federal funds needed for Medi-Cal match. EFC shall reimburse and pay BHCS the full invoice amount no later than 30 days after receiving each invoice
- 4. Confidentiality of Records: As the invoices are records that will contain confidential information concerning specific student information, and information that could identify the student, even if the names were redacted, the invoices shall be treated as confidential to the extent required by law. These records may contain information and be considered protected health information and student records protected under the Education Code.
- 5. Interim Reimbursement Charges: As final actual rates and costs related to qualified services may not immediately be available, BHCS shall invoice for the provisional or interim rate being used at the time and EFC shall pay these amounts to BHCS. After the final actual rates and costs are known, BHCS will perform a reconciliation and credit or invoice EFC for the difference in the amount paid by EFC and the actual cost.
- 6. *Amount:* Medi-Cal reimbursements are considered the actual amounts received from the Medi-Cal state program for each student. Any match funding that may be required is part of actual costs and, pursuant to the terms of this MOU, shall be paid by EFC. The Medi-Cal State Maximum Allowable charges for services may not be the actual cost of services, and EFC shall pay actual costs
- 7. **Change in Eligibility**: EFC understands that Medi-Cal eligibility may change while a student is receiving services and, after any reconciliation, EFC shall receive a credit from or pay to BHCS any difference in costs if Medi-Cal eligibility, status or reimbursement amount(s) changes, as appropriate.
- 8. **Reconciliation:** EFC understands that the Medi-Cal reimbursement process, through no fault of BHCS, can take years to be reconciled by the State and EFC agrees to make final payments for all amounts due or owed under the terms of this MOU after reconciliation by the State or BHCS.

- 9. Payment of Local Share: EFC understands that payment of any federal share of Medi-Cal, Healthy Families, and other federal public funding is based on the amount of local funding that must be provided by EFC. As outlined in Budget Exhibit 1, EFC agrees to timely payment of the State and the local share of costs, which consists of fifty cents (\$.50) for every one dollar of the (\$1.00) total amount indicated under the "Additional EFC Services/Allocations Total" which is \$895,230.00. EFC will pay fifty cents (\$.50) for every one dollar of \$447,615.00 of services attributable to the student(s) being served, so as to not jeopardize the federal share match. EFC shall not use any federal funding for payment of the match funding for Medi-Cal or other federal public funding eligible services to students.
- 10. **Settlement:** BHCS will use its best efforts to calculate settlements for the year promptly. Settlement consists of accounting and making adjustments based on actual costs to BHCS, final reimbursement charges, actual cost of providers plus administrative cost less any Medi-Cal payments received by BHCS for the service(s) provided. Settlement will be based on information available to BHCS, but does not include any adjustment that may be made after review, audit or directions from the State or other auditing or funding agency.

VIII. <u>Cooperative Efforts and other Responsibilities</u>

- 1. Teachers, instructional assistants and the principal at the EFC schools shall work cooperatively with Mental Health Staff.
- 2. EFC Staff will assign a manager to coordinate services with Mental Health staff and the assigned manager will attend regular Coordination of Service Team (C.O.S.T.) meetings and participate in joint in-service trainings.
- 3. EFC Staff will support Mental Health Staff when there are mental health interventions with students.
- 4. BHCS will provide EFC with aggregate monthly service reports for the students served at the EFC schools.
- 5. Mental Health Staff may assist the families of uninsured students to enroll them in Medi-Cal. However, nothing in this MOU obligates BHCS to apply for Medi-Cal for any student or their family.
- 6. EFC and BHCS shall each name a contact person for programmatic technical questions and assistance and one for billing or payment questions and assistance. The names and contact information shall be provided within in 30 days of execution of this MOU, and thereafter updated in September of each year and if there are any changes.

IX. General Terms

 Term: This MOU covers the time period <u>July 1, 2017 to June 30, 2018</u>. The term shall be automatically renewed for a period of twelve additional months on July 1st of each year, unless terminated sooner by written notice of either party. This MOU replaces and supersedes the prior MOU for School Based Behavioral Health (SBBH) Programs as of July 1, 2017, and the parties hereby amends and terminates that prior MOU as of June 30, 2017.

- 2. **Termination of Services Provided by MOU**: Services provided under this MOU may be terminated by any Party upon the giving of sixty (60) days prior written notice to the other Party. EFC understands that notice is required to allow mental health services to be terminated with the individuals being served in a therapeutically appropriate manner.
- Educationally Related Mental Health Services: With respect to the provision of Educationally Related Mental Health Services ("ERMHS") under the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act ("IDEA"), 20 U.S.C. II 1400, et seq., nothing in this MOU is intended to establish or impose upon the County of Alameda, including BHCS any legal obligation under IDEA, or other federal or state law, to provide ERMHS.
- 4. **Non Party:** EFC will not seek to have the County added as a party to any administrative or civil action brought by a student pursuant to the IDEA or otherwise related to the provision of services, and EFC will cooperate with the County in having the County dismissed from such proceedings should the County be so added.
- 5. **State Reimbursement:** Nothing in the MOU is intended to, or shall, prevent any party to this MOU from pursuing reimbursement from any state or federal agency or funding source for services.
- 6. *Informal Resolution:* If a dispute arises between any of the signatories of this MOU, the Parties involved in the dispute will make a good faith effort to resolve the dispute between them in a timely fashion before seeking an intervention.
- 7. *Days:* Days shall mean calendar days.
- 8. *Modifications:* This MOU may not be modified or altered except in writing signed by all Parties.
- 9. *Third Party Rights*: Nothing in this MOU shall be construed to give any rights or benefits to anyone other than the Parties to this MOU.
- 10. *Severability*: The unenforceability, invalidity or illegality of any provision of this MOU shall not render the other provisions unenforceable, invalid, or illegal. If a court of competent jurisdiction holds any provision of this MOU to be illegal, unenforceable, or invalid in whole or in part for any reason, the validity and enforceability of the remaining provisions, or portions of them, will not be affected, unless an essential purpose of this MOU would be defeated by the loss of the illegal, unenforceable, or invalid provision.
- 11. *Waiver:* No waiver of a breach, failure of any condition, or any right or remedy contained in or granted by the provisions of this MOU shall be effective unless it is in writing and signed by the Party waiving the breach, failure, right or remedy. No waiver of any breach, failure, right or remedy shall be deemed a waiver of any other breach, failure, right or remedy, whether or not similar, nor shall any waiver constitute a continuing waiver unless the writing so specifies.
- 12. *Indemnification:* To the fullest extent permitted by law, EFC shall hold harmless, defend and indemnify the County of Alameda, its Board of Supervisors, agencies employees and

representative ("the County") from and against any and all claims, losses, damages, liabilities and expenses, including but not limited to attorneys' fees, arising out of or resulting from the performance of services under this MOU, including administrative or civil actions brought pursuant to the IDEA against the County as a result of an alleged denial of Free Appropriate Public Education (FAPE) arising out of EFC's alleged failure to offer or provide appropriate services to a student, or which arises out of or is any way connected with the performance of this agreement (collectively "Liabilities") except where such Liabilities are caused solely by the negligence or willful misconduct of any indemnities. The County may participate in the defense of any such claim without relieving EFC of any obligation hereunder. EFC will conduct all settlement negotiations in good faith and in a manner that is not injurious to County's interests. If County is made a party to the action, EFC will conduct all settlement negotiations with the participation of the County.

- 13. *Headings:* Headings are for convenience of reference only and shall in no way affect interpretation of the MOU.
- 14. *Notices:* All notices, requests, demands, or other communications under this MOU shall be in writing. Notices shall be given for all purposes as follows:

Personal delivery: When personally delivered to the recipient, notices are effective on delivery.

First Class Mail: When mailed first class to the last address of the recipient known to the party giving notice, notice is effective three (3) mail delivery days after deposit in a United States Postal Service office or mailbox. Certified Mail: When mailed certified mail, return receipt requested, notice is effective on receipt, if delivery is confirmed by a return receipt.

Overnight Delivery: When delivered by overnight delivery (Federal Express/Airborne/United Parcel Service) with charges prepaid or charged to the sender's account, notice is effective on delivery, if delivery is confirmed by the delivery service.

Facsimile transmission: When sent by facsimile (fax) to the last facsimile number of the recipient known to the party giving notice, notice is effective on receipt, provided that (a) a duplicate copy of the notice is promptly given by first-class or certified mail or by overnight delivery, or (b) the receiving party delivers a written confirmation of receipt. Any notice given by telex or facsimile shall be deemed received on the next business day if it is received after 5:00 p.m. (recipient's time) or on a non-business day.


