

Preschool Expansion Priorities for Alameda County, May 2016
Prepared by the Alameda County Early Care and Education Program
(Approved by the Early Care and Education Local Planning Council March 18th, 2016)

The Early Education & Support Division (EESD) of the California Department of Education published guidance for compliance with Assembly Bill 1857, which requires that any new funds must go to the most underserved areas of California. To consider Alameda County for expansion funding, the Planning Council must identify the most underserved areas in our county by zip code. In April 2003, EESD published Management Bulletin 03-05, which further clarifies the process to establish priorities. It states, “The amended statute specifies that by May 30 of each year, upon approval by the county board of supervisors and the county superintendent of schools, each LPC shall submit to CDD the local priorities it has identified that reflect all child care needs in the county.” The guidance from the state outlines a very specific process for assigning zip code priorities based both on the total unmet need in each zip code as well as the percent of unmet need. Alameda County must assign priorities as follows:

Priority 1	Priority 2
300 children unserved & at least 40% of the zip code total	200 children unserved & at least 40% of the zip code total

Priority 3:

- Option 1: 25% or more of eligible children underserved AND more than 100 eligible children underserved.
- **Option 2: All other zip codes in the County. (Alameda County’s choice)**
- Option 3: No other zip codes in the County.

Using Fall 2014 data from the EESD, along with 2015 data from local Head Start Agencies and Stage 1 subcontractors, we compared the Total Supply (the number of preschool-aged children who are in subsidized care) against the Total Demand (census data on the number of families earning less than 70% of state median income) by age and zip code. We subtracted the Total Supply from the Total Demand to get the Unmet Need, which represents the estimated number of children who are underserved for subsidized preschool in each zip code.

Total Demand - Total Supply = Total Unmet Need

Zip Code Priorities for Preschool (3 & 4 Year Olds)

Priority One (*five zip codes*): 94501, 94546, 94601, 94603, 94621

Priority Two: No zip codes

Priority Three: All other zip codes in the County

We subtracted the Total Supply from the Total Demand to get the Unmet Need, which represents the estimated number of children who are underserved for subsidized child care in each zip code.

$$\text{Total Demand} - \text{Total Supply} = \text{Total Unmet Need}$$

Priority One (*seven zip codes*): 94546, 94541, 94544, 94545, 94601, 94603, 94605

Priority Two (*six zip codes*): 94608, 94602, 94607, 94610, 94619, 94580

Priority Three: All other zip codes in the County
