AC Reentry Housing Vendor Pool	The Housing Vendor Pool will help establish immediate assistance to participants who are homeless or at risk of homelessness. Services available include: housing case management, emergency shelter, transitional housing, assistance securing long-term housing and short-term rental assistance, if needed. Flexibility allows responsiveness to the needs of participants.	TBD	Round 1: ACPD is negotiating contracts with 3 vendors: BACs, BOSS and Lao. The Board approved a pool of providers on 7/13/2021. Round 2: One bid was received and is being evaluated.
