



Role Description

Overview

Alameda County is 739 square miles and employs nearly 10,000 people, many of whom travel on the job. In 2003, our vehicle fleet accounted for 12% of the County's total operational emissions. To alleviate the environmental impact of County operations, GSA has procured 85 electric vehicles and 113 EV charging ports. The increased power demand and operations logistics of running an EV fleet has presented the County with a number of new challenges and opportunities.






The County's policy requires that vehicles are driven an average of 500 miles/month. This analysis showed that pool vehicles are more utilized than department-specific vehicles. Most of our electric vehicles are also concentrated in the pool. If we expanded our pool vehicle fleet, we could save money by reducing fuel costs, more easily purchase zero-emission vehicles, and remove barriers to clean commuting for employees.
