I. Federal Legislative Update - CJ Lake

Schedule

The House and Senate are in session this week and are scheduled to hold votes. The Senate is preparing to consider the FY22 National Defense Authorization Act, and the House is working toward a vote on the Build Back Better reconciliation bill.

Reconciliation

Democrats' reconciliation bill will be discussed in the House as lawmakers return to Washington today. The CBO has released assessments from six committees for the BBB, but it has not weighed in on the major portions of the package, namely the Ways and Means, Energy and Commerce and Education and Labor titles.

House Democrats are pushing for a vote on the roughly \$2 trillion bill by the end of this weekend before Congress leaves D.C. for their Thanksgiving break. If the bill passes the House, it will move to the Senate. There will likely be several more weeks of negotiations, and this legislation may go on into early next year.

Infrastructure

President Biden signed the bipartisan Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act this afternoon after the House approved the bill on Friday, November 5, 2021. The Departments of Transportation and Energy has the responsibility to implement the law, standing-up new programs and finding ways to quickly get money out the door. The roughly \$1.2 trillion bill contains an estimated \$550 billion in new spending above baseline levels.

Although the legislature remains on their fall recess, work is actively being done in the Capitol. Legislators are considering their legislative packages for 2022 and legislative staff are moving to the "swing space" where they will be housed until 2025, when construction of the "new" side of the Capitol is expected to be finished. Redistricting Following the release of the preliminary congressional and legislative maps, the State's independent redistricting commission will be holding a series of public input meetings starting Wednesday, November 17. Final maps must be submitted to the Secretary of State's office by December 27, 2021.
