Summary/Action Minutes

I. Federal Legislative Update – CJ Lake

Schedule

Both chambers are in session this week. They'll leave Washington for the Spring recess on Friday and will return on April 17, 2023.

House Energy Package

The House is scheduled to take up Republicans' energy package (H.R.1) to overhaul the environmental permitting process and expand oil and gas lease sales on federal lands, among other changes. The House Rules Committee is slated to meet today to set the terms of floor debate for that measure, which would require a simple majority for passage. The package combines about 20 different measures approved by the Energy and Commerce, Natural Resources, and Transportation and Infrastructure committees. The most notable inclusion in the bill is language from Rep. Garret Graves' "BUILDER Act" which would make changes to federal permitting laws in an effort to expedite project permit approvals. H.R. 1 would also modify how revenue from energy leasing is shared among states and the federal government, give the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission exclusive authority to approve or deny applications related to the export or import of natural gas to or from a foreign country, and repeal several incentive programs established or expanded by the 2022 Inflation Reduction Act. The House should pass the bill before recessing at the end of the week, but the Senate lacks the votes to pass the full package.

Other House Votes

The House is set to consider four measures under suspension of the rules, which would require a twothirds majority for passage or adoption. Three proposals are focused on China, including a bill that would direct the State Department to work to reclassify China's status as a developing country in international organizations. The House Judiciary Committee will mark up eight immigration and border bills after the House returns in mid-April. House Republicans are deeply split on how aggressive they should be in their approach to immigration and border security, and Republican leaders are concerned they do not currently have the votes for passage.

Senate Action

At 3:00 pm today, the Senate will resume consideration of S.316, a bill to repeal the authorizations for use of military force against Iraq. Last week, the Senate locked in a time agreement to pass the bill by the middle of this week. The Senate will vote on as many as six additional Republican-authored amendments to the underlying bill. All of the amendments require 60 votes to pass, it is unlikely any of them will be enacted.

Budget Hearings

Defense Secretary Lloyd Austin, Interior Secretary Deb Haaland, Attorney General Merrick Garland, Agriculture Secretary Tom Vilsack, Homeland Security Secretary Alejandro Mayorkas and Treasury Secretary Janet Yellen will lead a parade of Biden administration officials testifying before the House and Senate Appropriations committees this week on the FY24 budget request.

Debt Ceiling

The House Budget Committee will hold a "Fiscal State of the Union" hearing on Wednesday. President Biden and Speaker McCarthy have not met to discuss raising the debt ceiling since their first meeting on February 1, 2023. There is no formal default date yet on the \$31.4 trillion national debt, with Treasury Secretary Yellen stating that the Treasury Department can pay its bills through early June, while the Congressional Budget Office (CBO) estimates that the federal government will run out of money sometime between July and September.
