RECOMMENDATION:

Authorize the Purchasing Agent, or her designee, to execute a contract (Master Contract No. 902308; Procurement Contract No. 25991) with Underwater Resources, Inc. (Principal: Thomas Belcher; Location: San Leandro) to provide underwater structures maintenance services to the Alameda County Flood Control and Water Conservation District, for the term of 10/6/2023 - 10/5/2026, in the amount of \$750,000.

DISCUSSION/SUMMARY:

The Alameda County Flood Control and Water Conservation District (District) provides flood protection functions throughout the nine District zones in western Alameda County. The District plans designs, constructs, and maintains flood control facilities, including natural creeks and wetlands, channels, levees, pump stations, dams, and reservoirs. The District's pump stations are a vital component of the District's overall flood control system, essential for protecting life and property from flooding. Under normal operating conditions, the District desires that the pump stations operate efficiently, reliably, and sustainably to manage peak stormwater flows. The District also desires that the pump stations be resilient enough to continue to operate - or be readily repairable - under unforeseen conditions such as natural disasters (earthquakes, extreme flooding, fire, etc.). The District is committed to supporting Alameda County's sustainability initiatives, specifically clean energy and energy efficiency for this project. The Contractor will maintain underwater structures for the District's Lake Merritt Pump Station.

SELECTION CRITERIA/PROCESS:

The District has determined that Alameda County does not currently have the resources to provide underwater structures maintenance services.

The District worked with General Services Agency –Procurement to develop a Request for Proposal (RFP), which was issued on May 15, 2023, posted on the website for 32 days, sent to the E-Gov Professional Services

Underwater Structures Maintenance Services

– Current Contract Opportunities mailing service, and emailed to the Chambers of Commerce e-mail group. The RFP was also advertised in The Inter-City Express on May 17, 202, and The Argus on May 19, 2023. A vendor outreach event was conducted on May 17, 2023, followed by one networking/bidders conference on May

22, 2023, which was attended by six attendees representing four vendors.

On June 16, 2023, one bidder submitted a response to the RFP. The response was evaluated by the County Selection Committee. A maximum total of 550 evaluation points was available for this RFP. The total evaluation points include 50 preference points derived from a 5% preference for local vendors and a 5% preference for certified Small Local Emerging Business (SLEB) vendors, for a total of 10%.

Underwater Resources, Inc. was the sole qualified vendor and is being recommended for award.

Underwater Resources, Inc. is a certified SLEB (Certified Small: 6-00068; Expiration: 8/31/2024).
