RECOMMENDATION:

Authorize the Purchasing Agent, or her designee, to execute a contract (Master Contract No. 902365; Procurement Contract No. 26831) with Alcohol Monitoring Systems, Inc., dba SCRAM Systems (Principal: John Hennessey; Location: Littleton, Colorado) to provide electronic monitoring services to the Alameda County Probation Department, for the term of 7/1/2024 – 6/30/2027, in the amount of \$819,013.

DISCUSSION/SUMMARY:

The Alameda County Probation Department (ACPD) is seeking to provide confidential electronic monitoring services using Radio Frequency (RF) Global Positioning System (GPS) equipment and services, data collection and equipment, and software support services. This contract will deliver the remote tracking technology and expertise needed for juveniles and adults under ACPD supervision requiring monitoring services as an alternative to detention. Electronic monitoring is a safe, humane, and cost-effective way to monitor clients' compliance with court orders and legal mandates intended to facilitate positive behavioral change and reduce risk, and recidivism.

On 9/5/2019 ACPD entered into a contract (PC 18079) with Tyler Technologies, Inc. to provide electronic monitoring services. This contract was amended three times by the First Amendment to Agreement (November 12, 2019), Second Amendment to Agreement (December 10, 2021) and Third Amendment to Agreement (October 27, 2022) and is set to expire on September 30, 2024 requiring the department to conduct a new Request for Proposal for this mandated service. Tyler Technologies, Inc. is currently providing 157 electronic monitoring devices in use by probation clients.

SELECTION CRITERIA/PROCESS:

ACPD has determined that Alameda County does not currently have the resources to provide electronic monitoring equipment and services.

ACPD worked with General Services Agency–Procurement to develop a Request for Proposal (RFP), which was issued on December 12, 2023, posted on the County and GSA LinkedIn websites for 71 days, emailed to the Chambers of Commerce e-mail group, and sent to the E-Gov Goods and Services – Current Contract Opportunities mailing service. The RFP was also advertised in The Inter-City Express on December 14, 2023, and the What's Happenings Tri-City Voice on December 19, 2023. A vendor outreach was conducted on December 13, 2023, followed by one networking/bidders' conference on December 20, 2023, which was attended by nine vendors.

On February 21, 2024, two bidders submitted responses to the RFP. All responses were evaluated, and the vendors were interviewed by the County Selection Committee. A maximum total of 550 evaluation points was available for this RFP. The total evaluation points include 50 preference points derived from a 5% preference for local vendors and a 5% preference for certified Small Local Emerging Business (SLEB) vendors, for a total of 10%.

Alcohol Monitoring Systems, Inc., dba SCRAM Systems was the highest scoring responsive/qualified vendor and is being recommended for the award.

The SLEB program applied to this RFP; however, there were no subcontracting opportunities. The Office of Acquisition Policy has issued SLEB Waiver No. 9317 (Expiring: 5/31/2027).

FINANCING:

Funding for the contract is from existing appropriations (\$381,013) and SB 129 Pre-trial grant (\$438,000). It is included in the Fiscal Year 2024-25 proposed budget and will be requested in future budget years. No additional appropriations are required and there will be no increase in net County cost.

The electronic monitoring services meet the 10X goal pathway of a **Crime Free County** in support of our shared visions of a **Thriving and Resilient Population** and **Safe and Livable Communities**.
