



Sustainable Purchasing (or Sustainable Procurement) is the practice of making purchasing decisions that intentionally strengthen our environment, society, and economy. It is a purchasing approach that aligns an agency's values with its market influence. When looking through an environment-only lens, sustainable purchasing can also be referred to as environmentally preferable purchasing (EPP) or green purchasing. Sustainable purchasing can support a variety of sustainability-related agency values, from reducing greenhouse gas emissions and waste generation, to supporting ethical working conditions and thriving communities. The light-emitting diode (LED) is today's most energy-efficient and rapidly developing lighting technology. Compared to fluorescent lamps, LEDs use only about half the electricity to produce the same amount of light. Quality LEDs last longer, are less prone to breakage, and offer comparable or better light quality than other types of lighting. LED lamps and retrofit kits are often compatible with existing light fixtures with no need to rewire or replace fixtures, and LED products are available for most lighting applications.

When you are seeking these products in a store or online, check the product details to confirm it meets the Minimum Requirements listed below. If lighting is included in a construction project, confirm that the designer and contractor are informed about the following Minimum Requirements as well.



Related Tips

- Have the product vendor provide training on the proper use, storage, and disposal of its green cleaning products, especially any concentrated chemicals. Failing to use products and dispensing systems according to the manufacturer's instruction.
- dispensing systems according to the manufacturer's instructions can result in poor product performance, costly overuse, and/or harmful exposure to concentrated chemicals.
- Reduce the number of different cleaning products you use. For example, use a multi-purpose cleaner for
 most cleaning tasks. Concentrated multi-purpose cleaners can be diluted at different rates to accommodate
 various cleaning tasks (glass cleaning to heavy-duty cleaning).
- Limit the use of air fresheners. Instead, work to identify and remedy the cause of persistent odors, such as
 poor air circulation, clogged floor drains, mildew, mold, or stains.
- If your facility needs to update its product dispensing systems to begin using products that meet the Minimum Requirements, check first to see if the distributor or product manufacturer of the compliant products offers applicable dispensing systems at no cost.
- . Invest in reusable cleaning tools, such as microfiber cloths, when laundry facilities or services are available.
- Safely dispose of unused cleaning chemicals by using StopWaste's re:source online tool to find applicable disposal facilities in your area.

Benefits

Buying certified green cleaning products:

- Supports healthy indoor environments for building occupants and cleaning staff by reducing exposures to toxic chemicals that can cause eye, skin, and respiratory irritation; and chronic health issues such as asthma, reproductive problems, and cancer.
- Reduces the amount of toxic chemicals going down the drain, which supports healthier aquatic ecosystems.

Buying concentrated cleaning products:

- Reduces waste due to less packaging per volume of usable cleaner.
- Decreases transportation impacts per volume of usable cleaner.
- Is more cost-effective on a per-use basis than ready-to-use cleaners.

CDC Cleaning and Disinfecting Guidance to Prevent COVID-19

Cleaning of visibly dirty surfaces followed by disinfection is a best practice measure for prevention of COVID-19 and other viral respiratory illnesses in households and community settings.

Clean and disinfect high-touch surfaces daily in household common areas (e.g., tables, hard-backed chairs, doorknobs, light switches, phones, tables, touch screens, remote controls, keyboards, handles, desks, toilets, sinks)

Environmental and Health Concernsof Cleaning Chemicals

- Acute Exposure to Toxic Chemicals
 - Chemical burns/serious injury to the eyes, skin or lungs
 - Headaches and central nervous system (CNS) effects
- Chronic Exposure to Toxic Chemicals
 - Asthma, cancer, reproductive and developmental toxicity, endocrine disruption
 - Toxicity to fish and other aquatic species
- Packaging Waste
- Transportation Impacts

Green Seal's Green Cleaning Standard

- Products may not be corrosive or sensitizing to skin or cause serious eye damage
- Prohibits/Limits
 - **⊠** Carcinogens, mutagens and reproductive toxins
 - ★ Asthmagens (respiratory sensitizers)
 - ☑ Other chemicals of concern: alkylphenol ethoxylates (APEs),
 2-butoxyethanol, halogenated solvents, heavy metals, ozone-depleting compounds, PFAS, phthalates, VOCs, and more
- Products must meet ASTM performance standards

How to Transition to Green Cleaners

- Engage custodial staff and assess current product use (identify high-usage/high-hazard products)
- Identify products on certifiers' lists
- Pilot test products (and dilution equipment)
 in select locations/applications to find products that work
- Compare prices of acceptable products
- Purchase products and services (e.g., consult existing vendors, look on County contracts, solicit bids, etc.)
- Train staff on new products and equipment







Health Hazards of Conventional Disinfectants

Chlorine bleach (Sodium hypochlorite)

- Causes occupational asthma
- Corrosive to eyes and skin
- High aquatic toxicity



Quaternary ammonium chlorides ("Quats")

- Asthmagens
- Corrosive, need to be rinsed off
- Concentrate in sewage sludge
- May contribute to "super bugs"

Disinfectants

Use this Guide When Purchasing

 Disinfectants for non-porous surfaces (e.g. tile, metal, glass, rigid plastic, laminated surfaces, etc.)

Disinfectants are inherently toxic, as they are formulated to kill living organisms. As a result, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (U.S. EPA) and California Department of Pesticide Regulation (CA DPR) register all surface disinfectants as pesticides. Although all "antimicrobial" products have risks, many conventional disinfectants, such as chlorine bleach, pose more serious risks to custodial workers and building occupants because they contain active ingredients that have been found to cause asthma, cancer, skin sensitization, or other health hazards. Yet, surface disinfectants with more benign health and environmental impacts than conventional disinfectants are readily available, cost effective, and have equivalent or greater efficacy in killing bacteria, viruses, and fungi.

Reusable Cloth Towels and Mops (Terry, Cotton or Microfiber)

- Microplastic concerns

The following environmental specifications can be incorporated into a bid solicitation document (e.g., an Invitation to Bid) for Janitorial Supplies.

A. Cleaning Chemicals

- 1. All cleaning chemical products used to perform this contract must:
 - a. Have at least one the following third-party, multi-attribute certifications:
 - i. Green Seal
 - ii. Safer Choice
 - iii. UL ECOLOGO
 - b. Not be packaged in an aerosol container
- 2. On the attached bid sheet, the Bidder must list and provide documentation of compliance for each cleaning chemical product it is planning to use to perform the services on this contract (e.g., a link to the product on one of the following websites):
 - a. Green Seal Certified Product Directory
 - b. Safer Choice-Certified Products
 - c. <u>UL SPOT</u> (filter for UL ECOLOGO-certified products by product type)
 - d. <u>Ecomedes</u> (certification data aggregator with links to products with Green Seal, Safer Choice and UL ECOLOGO certification)

JANITORIAL SERVICES AND SUPPLIES SAMPLE BID LANGUAGE

Environmental Requirements for Janitorial Service Providers

The following environmental specifications can be incorporated into a bid solicitation document (e.g., a Request for Proposals) for Janitorial Services.

A. Cleaning Chemicals

- 1. All cleaning chemical products used to perform this contract (with the exception of graffiti removers and surface disinfectants) in the bid solicitation document must:
 - a. Have at least one the following third-party, multi-attribute certifications:
 - i. Green Seal
 - ii. Safer Choice
 - iii. UL ECOLOGO
- 2. On the bid sheet, the Bidder must list and provide documentation of compliance for each cleaning chemical product it is planning to use to perform the services on this contract (e.g., a link to the product on one of the following websites):
 - a. Green Seal Certified Product Directory
 - b. Safer Choice-Certified Products
 - c. <u>UL SPOT</u> (filter for UL ECOLOGO-certified products by product type)
 - d. <u>Ecomedes</u> (certification data aggregator with links to products with Green Seal, Safer Choice and UL ECOLOGO certification)

Amendment for Scope of Services for Janitorial Services

The City of San Leandro is mandated by the State of California to comply with <u>CalRecycle's</u> SB 1383. This senate bill requires the <u>City</u> and any of it's contractors to purchase paper products, including janitorial paper products, with a minimum percentage of post-consumer recycled content (PCRC). For janitorial paper products, the PCRC percentages are as follows:

- Toilet paper 45% PCRC
- Paper towels and wipers 40% PCRC
- Toilet seat covers 20% PCRC
- Facial tissue 10% PCRC

All janitorial paper supplies purchased under this contract must meet the PCRC percentages listed above.

Exemptions due to availability and excessive costs must be approved by Public Works...provide contact.
